WORKSHOPS

A series of workshops led by experienced practitioners will be held covering a range of topics:

Improving HSE Performance in Complex Organizations *ERM Rescan* – This workshop will focus on the challenge organizations face with improving overall HSE performance while managing multiple facilities or business units that have differing levels of maturity, programs and resources. Areas to be covered include organizational maturity, diagnostic tools, and programs and processes to address performance challenges – with a tie into how to tailor audit programs to achieve sustainable performance improvement.



Best Practice Audit Planning and Program Management SPAN OMS Inc Risk-based and value-focused audit programs are often talked about, but the concepts are not often applied effectively to audits and audit programs. This workshop, based on years of learning and practical experience, will provide insights and help improve your skill set in the application of risk assessment for planning and prioritizing your audit program – from a long-term perspective to the planning, execution and reporting of individual audits.
