

Certification Maintenance

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- Program has the intent of assisting CRSPs keep pace with changes affecting professional OHS practice
- CRSP/PSACs are required to maintain their certification by:
 - Payment of an annual renewal fee
 - Submission of proof of professional development activities every five (5) years
 - three major areas: Professional Development, Examinations and Additional Certifications, Professional Pursuits.
